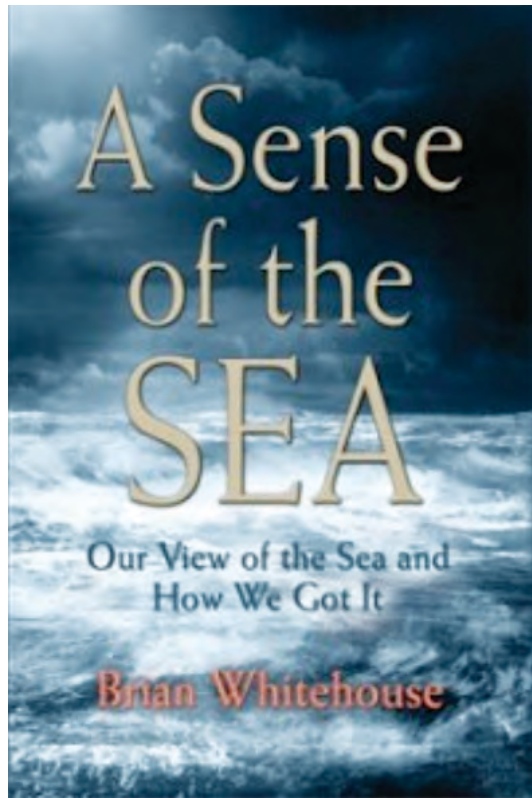


Recommended Reading
